Honors Art Portfolio Sections

- 1. Sustained Investigation = A minimum of <u>6 pieces</u> that demonstrate sustained investigation through practice, experimentation and revision.
- 2. Breadth = A minimum of <u>6 pieces</u> that demonstrate a wide range of drawing/design approaches.

Prompts

Respond to all the prompts. You may also add your own prompts if you feel they are relevant and important to reflect on. Use full sentences/paragraphs.

There are NO wrong answers here and I'm not going to judge you based on your answers unless I believe you are being fake and not really reflecting. In that case I will send the project back to you to be rewritten by your truthful, flawed self; not the perfect version we try to show other people.

Process:

Identify the following for each piece:

- Materials used (100 characters maximum, including spaces):
- Processes used (100 characters maximum, including spaces):
- Size (height × width × depth, in inches)
- Identify the inquiry or question(s) that is guiding your sustained investigation.
- Describe how this piece shows evidence of practice, experimentation, and/or revision guided by your questions(s) or inquiry. (Not every piece will include all three.)

Product:

- What was successful about this piece?
- What could change/been done better to improve the piece?

Conclusion:

• Do you feel happy with the end results of your piece? Explain why or why not.

Perception:

- Ask three people what they believe the piece is about or what your intention was when you created it. Record their answers:
- Do their interpretations match what you were hoping to get across?
- If not, how do you feel about the way they interpreted it?
- If you are not pleased with the way the piece is interpreted by the viewer, how could you adjust your approach to the work to create a clearer connection to your inquiry?

Next Time (Guiding Questions):

- What are you thinking of doing for the next project (that you haven't started yet)?
- How might this piece show evidence of experimentation?
- Are you currently on track with your work output or are you falling behind? If you are falling behind what is your plan to improve the situation?
